Memory Care Unit Gets a Homey Feel

Leah Carnes, CNA and her husband Paul, have been improving the Memory Care Unit at Village Manor to give it a more “homey” feel.

Until recently, the large common area for this unit felt very institutional. A corner was designated for five recliners which acted as the living room, and dining room tables accommodated eating and gaming activities.

Now the cozy corner with a bay window is an interactive kitchen space with an inoperable kitchen sink, vintage stove, and a Betsy Ross refrigerator. All donated by a generous man from Newton, Ks. The refrigerator is stocked with plastic food. “We have a couple of residents who stand here and discuss what they are making for dinner. They are playing house.” Leah has also hung plaid curtains and created a faux window on the wall. One of the dining tables has been moved to this corner to complete the feel of a kitchen with a dining room table.

Linda’s idea to transform this space, was not a new one. In her previous life, while her and Paul lived in Oregon and were raising their children, they operated an adult foster home. “We took a big Mennonite Church and converted it to be able to house five residents. It was work for me, but for them, it was their home. It was important to make the space as homey as possible. The same is true here. These people live here. This is there home.”

Another part of recreating this large common area was to create the feeling of a living room. The recliners are now arranged around a media/fireplace console complete with a cozy rug that helps define the space.

Leah said there are more plans in the works. On one of the walls, they will be creating a space that will feel like a garage with all the tools to “fix” things. The tools will be plastic as well just like the play food for the kitchen.

The common area has a small cabinet that acts as a changing table, but Leah would like to create a space that actually feels like whole nursery for the residents who love to play with baby dolls.

For residents who live with dementia or Alzheimer's, they often have a distorted sense of time perception. Many of which revert to time periods long ago. Rather than trying to bring the individual back to reality, caretakers may try to enter theirs, which is exactly what Leah's revisions to the common area is doing. By providing these interactive spaces that are very real to the residents, the staff is able to build trust and reduce anxiety among the residents.

“We have a lot of residents who walk consistently because that's the nature of this unit, but we have started to see them become very busy. They have started to separate into little friend cliques. We have a group that sits here,” as she points to the dining room table in the ‘play kitchen’ “to have lunch together, and we have a group that sits here in front of the fireplace. Instead of the endless pacing back and forth, they are treating it like home. It's so amazing and it's been really fun.”

Leah said she is so thankful to work at a place like Village Manor where she can share her ideas, and they are supported. “We of course have to take the budget into consideration, along with safety, but these really are small changes. They are not hard, they just take time.”




Home is where their heart is....
